The St. Croix Valley Korean-American Cultural Society, Inc. invites you to Camp Chosŏn! This non-profit, 501c-3 volunteer organization supports Korean-American children, youth and their families. Most camp participants are adoptees or children of adoptees. Camp Chosŏn is located on the beautiful grounds of Camp Lakamaga, a Girl Scout Camp, just north of St. Paul, Minnesota.

Camp Chosŏn gives participants the opportunity to appreciate Korea's rich culture and to celebrate their tie with Korean heritage. Campers experience the joy of building new friendships that are based on self-esteem and mutual respect. The Camp's rustic, tranquil setting promotes respect, awareness and enjoyment of nature.

Day Camp is offered to children, who enter grades K-6 in the Fall of 2019. An overnight option for campers entering 6th grade is available. On-site Resident Camp is offered to youth entering 7th through 11th grades in the Fall of 2019. Overnight living quarters include troop houses, cabins, and yurts.

Positive Korean Role Models

Knowledgeable and sensitive Koreans and Korean-Americans teach classes at Camp Chosŏn. Most counselors are Korean-American adoptees.

Day Camp Schedule

Day Camp begins daily at 9:00 a.m. with the Cho-Whey family gathering. Monday through Thursday, Day Camp ends at 4:00 p.m. Camp Chosŏn ends Friday after the Closing Ceremony, which occurs from 2:00-3:30.

Day Camp (Grades K-6)

Campers *entering* grades K-6 are exposed to Korean language, culture, storytelling, art, music, traditional dancing and drumming, Taekwondo, self-respect education and adoption issues. Recreational activities include Korean games, archery, and nature hikes.

Day Camp with Overnight Option

To provide a transition or bridge from Day Camp to Resident Camp, an overnight option is offered for children *entering* 6th grade in the Fall of 2019. This option, which occurs on Thursday night, extends the camp experience. Two meals, parent chaperones, and fun activities are included in the registration fee!

Resident Camp (Grades 7-11)

Resident Camp, for youth *entering* 7th grades through 11th grade, offers popular activities such as traditional drumming, sports, canoeing or kayaking, low ropes course, counselor fashion show, and a dance. Resident Camp helps Korean-American adolescents develop positive self-esteem and a sense of community.

Nursery Care

No-cost childcare for pre-K siblings is provided to instructors, parent volunteers and workshop presenters.

Meals

A delicious, home-made Korean lunch is served daily. For Day Campers, lunch is included in the registration fee. Resident Camp registration fees also include all meals, beginning with the evening meal on Sunday. Volunteers and visitors **MUST** purchase meal tickets, either at the time of registration (\$8.00 per meal) or on-site at the Korean Market (\$10.00 per meal).

Registration Information

Registration Form

Registration forms are located under the *Registration* tab at CampChosön.org/registration. Electronic registration is encouraged; however, printable mail-in forms are also available.

Registration Dates

For planning purposes, registration forms should be post-marked by April 15th. After June 1st, registration cannot be guaranteed.

Registration Fees

The St. Croix Valley Korean-American Cultural Society, Inc. strives to keep Camp Chosön affordable. Fees include one Camp Chosön t-shirt, meals, educational materials, instruction in Korean culture, activities, and the use of Camp Lakamaga's facility and staff. Registration fees after April 15th are:

\$310 – Day Camp (*entering* grades K-6 in Fall 2019)

\$330 – Day Camp with overnight option (*entering* grade 6 in Fall 2019)

\$530 – Resident Camp (*entering* grades 7-11 in Fall 2019)

Families with 2 or more campers are permitted to pay fees in two installments. One-half of the fee must be paid at the time of registration, and the second half is due no later than May 31st. In fairness to all families, children will not be allowed at Camp without prior registration and payment.

Financial Assistance

Financial assistance is available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Inquiries should be directed to treasurer@CampChosön.org. All requests are kept confidential and are subject to approval by the Treasurer and Board President.

Cancellation Policy

To cancel your registration, notify the Registrar in writing. Cancellation is effective on the postmark date on your correspondence. All cancellations are subject to a \$50 non-refundable fee per camper. Refunds will be issued within 30 days of written notice. Unfortunately, refunds cannot be issued for cancellations postmarked after May 31st.

Camp Chosŏn is for adults too!
