



Camp Choson Behavioral Policy

Camp Choson exists for the purpose of offering children with Korean heritage and their siblings opportunities to develop friendships, discover new skills, build respect for others and nature, and gain an appreciation for their cultural heritage.

Camp Choson is committed to providing a welcoming environment for our entire camp community. We ask that all members of the Camp Choson community behave in a mature, responsible way and treat each other with respect and dignity. We have developed this behavioral policy to create a safe, healthy, and positive atmosphere for all members of camp.

Campers are expected to refrain from the following behavior:

1. Disobedience, disrespectful or disruptive conduct.
2. Bullying behavior which includes (but is not limited to) excluding individuals, teasing, taunting, gossiping, or putting down another person with the intent to hurt them physically or emotionally.
3. Angry or vulgar language including swearing, name calling, or shouting in an aggressive manner. 4. Physical contact with another in any angry or threatening way
5. Any sexual behavior
6. Harassment or intimidation by words, gestures, body language or other threatening behavior
7. Theft or destruction of camp or other’s property, including natural resources.
8. Use or possession of illegal chemicals, tobacco, or alcohol on Camp Choson property. This includes arriving at camp under the influence of illegal chemicals or alcohol. It also includes misuse of prescription drugs.
9. Possession or use of any weapons or devices or objects which may be used as weapons (unless as a part of a supervised activity – e.g. archery).

Persons displaying any of these behaviors will be subject to progressive discipline up to and including dismissal from Camp. As every situation is unique, many factors will be considered before making final disciplinary decisions. Some behaviors will result in immediate dismissal without warning (e.g., assault, use or possession of illegal drugs or alcohol, possession of firearm), while others will result in a warning, loss of activities, meeting with Camp President, and/or a call to parents before resorting to dismissal.

Any camper who is dismissed from camp will not be eligible for any tuition refund.
